“RESOLVED THAT pursuant to the provisions of Sections 23, 42, 62 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, and the applicable rules thereunder (the ‘Companies Act’), the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999, as amended and rules and regulations framed thereunder, the Consolidated FDI Policy issued by the Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India from time to time, as in force, the Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Notifications and Circulars, if any, prescribed by the Government of India, the Reserve Bank of India (‘RBI’), the Securities and Exchange Board of India (‘SEBI’), including the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2018, as amended (the ‘ICDR Regulations’), the equity listing agreement executed with Stock Exchanges (‘Stock Exchanges’), on which the Company’s equity shares are listed, relevant Registrar of Companies (‘ROC’), or by any other competent authority, whether in India or abroad, from time to time, to the extent applicable including enabling provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (the ‘Listing Regulations’) and any other applicable law or regulation, (including any statutory amendment(s) modification(s) or variation(s) or re-enactment(s) thereof, for the time being in force) and in accordance with the provisions of the Memorandum of Association and Articles of Association of the Company and subject to such approvals (including regulatory approvals), consents, permissions and sanctions as may be necessary or required and such conditions as may be imposed or prescribed while granting such approvals, consents, permissions and sanctions, which may be agreed to by the Board of Directors of the Company (hereinafter referred to as “the Board” which term shall be deemed to mean and include one or more Committee(s) constituted/ to be constituted by the Board to exercise its powers including the powers conferred by this Resolution), the consent and approval of the Members of the Company (“Members”) be and is hereby accorded, to create, offer, issue and allot in one or more tranches, by way of a further public offer/issue, qualified institutions placement, private placement, rights issue or a combination thereof of equity shares of the Company, not exceeding 5 Lakhs (Five Lakhs Only), having face value of Rs. 10 (Rupees Ten) each (the ‘Equity Shares’), to all eligible investors, including residents and/or non-residents and/or institutions/banks/venture capital funds/alternative investment funds/foreign portfolio investors, mutual funds/pension funds, multilateral financial institutions, qualified institutional buyers and/or other incorporated bodies and/or individuals and/or trustees and/or stabilizing agent or otherwise, and whether or not such investors are Members of the Company (collectively the ‘Investors’), as may be decided by the Board in its absolute discretion and permitted under applicable laws and regulations, for an aggregate amount as may be decided by board or equivalent thereof, inclusive of such premium as may be fixed on such Securities by offering the Securities through public issue(s) or offer for sale or private placement(s) or any combination(s) thereof at such time or times, at such price or prices, at a discount or premium to market price or prices as permitted under applicable laws in such manner and on such terms and conditions including security, rate of interest etc. as may be deemed appropriate by the Board at its absolute discretion including the discretion to determine the categories of Investors to whom the offer, issue and allotment shall be made to the exclusion of other categories of Investors at the time of such offer, issue and allotment considering the prevailing

The Ministry of Corporate Affairs ('MCA') has vide its General Circular No. 03/2025 dated 22nd September, 2025 read together with General Circular Nos. 09/2024 dated 19th September, 2024, 09/2023 dated 25th September, 2023, 10/2022 dated 28th December, 2022, 02/2022 dated 5th May, 2022, 21/2021 dated 14th December, 2021, 19/2021 dated 8th December, 2021, 02/2021 dated 13th January, 2021, 20/2020 dated 5th May, 2020, 17/2020 dated 13th April, 2020 and 14/2020 dated 8th April, 2020 (collectively referred to as 'MCA Circulars') have permitted the holding of the Annual General Meeting ("AGM") through VC / OAVM, without the physical presence of the Members at a common venue. A. Voting through electronic means

1. In compliance with provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013, Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 as amended by the Companies (Management and Administration) Amendment Rules, 2015 and Regulation 44 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015 (Listing Regulations), the Company is pleased to provide members facility to exercise their right to vote on resolutions proposed to be considered at Annual General Meeting by electronic means and the business may be transacted through e-Voting Services. The facility of casting the votes by the members using an electronic voting system from a place other than venue of the Annual General Meeting ("remote e-voting") will be provided by National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL).
2. The members who have cast their vote by remote e-voting prior to the AGM may also attend the AGM but shall not be entitled to cast their vote again.

Sunita Tools Limited has built its manufacturing foundation over 4 decades in precision engineering, mould bases, ground plates and complex CNC machining. The Company's products support a wide range of manufacturing industries, including automotive, pharmaceuticals, electronics, consumer goods and other engineering sectors.

FY2025-26 was a significant year in the Company's evolution. Alongside strengthening the established mould-base and precision-engineering business, the Group accelerated its strategic expansion into aerospace and defence manufacturing. The strategy is to leverage existing competencies in precision machining, large-component manufacturing, process control and engineering to participate in higher-value and technologically demanding sectors.

Management's objective is to build a diversified precision engineering, aerospace and defence manufacturing platform while maintaining a strong focus on quality, customer service, regulatory compliance, capital discipline and execution.

FY2025-26 - A YEAR OF TRANSFORMATION

The year was characterised by investment in manufacturing capacity, specialised machinery, working capital and new business verticals. These initiatives were undertaken to strengthen the Company's existing operations and create the foundation for future participation in aerospace and defence opportunities.

- Expansion of precision-manufacturing capacity through advanced CNC and specialised machines.
- Development of manufacturing capabilities for 155mm empty artillery shell cases, subject to applicable approvals, qualification and regulatory requirements.
- Expansion of specialised aerospace and defence capabilities through Group entities.
- Creation of an international platform, including the United States presence and acquisition of New Mould Innovations (NMI), Kentucky, USA.
- Continued market development across India, the Middle East, the United States and Europe.
- Scouting more acquisitions across the globe.
- Third Generation of promoters have joined the business
- Engaging Deloitte TTL to review operational, regulatory, statutory compliances.
- Engaging Consultants to implement AS9100D IN VASAI CNC Factory.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS**Standalone:**

The Total Income of the Company stood at ₹ 4708.60 lakhs for the year ended March 31, 2026 as against ₹ 3014.83 lakhs in the previous year. The Company made a net profit of ₹ 650.66 lakhs for the year ended March 31, 2026 as compared to the net profit of ₹ 509.12 lakhs in the previous year.

Consolidated:

The Consolidated Total Income of the Company stood at ₹ 4794.95 lakhs for the year ended March 31, 2026 as against ₹ 3071.11 lakhs in the previous year. The Company made a net profit of ₹ 618.91 lakhs for the year ended March 31, 2026 as compared to the net profit of ₹ 512.52 lakhs in the previous year.

Balance Sheet Expansion and Capacity Creation

The balance sheet expanded substantially as the Company invested in fixed assets, capital work-in-progress and working capital. Tangible fixed assets stood at approximately ₹23.88 crore and capital work-in-progress at approximately ₹19.93 crore as at 31 March 2026. Inventories were approximately ₹24.97 crore and trade receivables approximately ₹28.12 crore.

Operating cash flow remained negative during the year, primarily reflecting the working-capital absorption associated with the expansion in receivables, inventory and other operating assets. Management recognises that improving conversion of accounting profits into operating cash flows is an important priority and continues to focus on receivable collections, inventory optimisation, customer payment terms and disciplined working-capital deployment. The diligent exercise for that Has started and will be visible in the coming months and FY.

EXPANSION OF MANUFACTURING CAPABILITIES

During FY2025-26, the Company strengthened its manufacturing infrastructure through the addition of a few advanced CNC and specialized machines of varying sizes and capabilities, including large machining centers, and other precision-manufacturing assets.

These investments enhance the Company's ability to manufacture larger, more complex and higher-precision components and are intended to support both the legacy precision-engineering business and emerging aerospace and defence applications.



AEROSPACE AND DEFENCE - STRATEGIC GROWTH VERTICAL

The Company's diversification into aerospace and defence was one of the most important strategic developments of FY2025-26. Existing capabilities in precision machining, metallurgy, process control and large-component manufacturing provide a foundation for specialised aerospace and defence manufacturing.

The Group is pursuing this opportunity through a combination of internal capacity creation, specialised subsidiaries, customer qualification, strategic relationships and international market development. Management views this vertical as a long-term growth

opportunity, while recognising the sector's stringent requirements for licensing, quality, traceability, qualification and regulatory compliance.

155mm Empty Artillery Shell Manufacturing Initiative

During FY2025-26, the Company progressed with the establishment of manufacturing capability for 155mm M107 empty artillery shell cases. Line 1 at Faridabad has been installed and is designed for approximately 120,000 shells per annum. The Company has also planned Line 2 with an envisaged capacity of approximately 240,000 shells per annum, with procurement under execution as disclosed in the Company's investor presentation.

The Company also entered into an interim sales arrangement during FY2025-26 relating to 155mm M107 empty shell cases. Commercial production and supply under such arrangements remain subject to applicable regulatory approvals, licences, prototype/product qualification, customer approvals and other contractual conditions. The Company therefore continues to treat the programme as a capability-development and commercialisation initiative subject to these conditions.

Aerospace Subsidiaries and Specialized Manufacturing

The Group's aerospace and defence strategy is also supported through Sunita having about 4 decades of precision machining experience and skill. These businesses are intended to develop specialised capabilities in aerospace and defence components, air-engineering applications, precision machined parts, and high-precision machining for aerospace, defence applications.

The longer-term objective is to build an integrated manufacturing ecosystem in which large-format machining, precision engineering and specialised aerospace capabilities complement one another. Accordingly implementation of AS9100D in our CNC machining facility has been planned

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

The Company's strategy increasingly includes international business development. During the year, the Group continued developing market relationships in Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Kuwait, the UAE and the United States, with the objective of diversifying the customer base and participating in global engineering and manufacturing supply chains.

The Group also established a United States presence through Sunita Defence Inc., with Chicago as its U.S. base, and completed its first U.S. acquisition, New Mould Innovations (NMI), Kentucky. NMI is positioned as a manufacturing platform in specialised cartridges and aerospace-grade grease applications. Management views the U.S. presence as a platform for customer development, manufacturing relationships and future strategic opportunities. This company has promising future and yet almost 90% of its potential is untapped which will be tapped during the coming years.

SUBSEQUENT DEVELOPMENTS AFTER 31 MARCH 2026

The following developments occurred after the close of FY2025-26 and are presented separately so that they are not construed as operating achievements of the financial year ended 31 March 2026.

Strong Q1 FY2026-27 Business Update

As disclosed by the Company on 24 July 2026, consolidated net sales value for the quarter ended 30 June 2026 was ₹18.64 crore compared with ₹4.14 crore in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, representing approximately 350% year-on-year growth. The Company also announced the addition of two large-size precision machines to support demand in the legacy business.

Polish Defence Technology Collaboration

On 30 July 2026, the Company disclosed that it had entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with a Polish defence manufacturing company engaged in research, design, development and manufacture of ISR drones, loitering ammunition and smart flying ammunition. The proposed collaboration is intended to explore strategic cooperation and advanced defence technology opportunities and remains subject to definitive arrangements, regulatory approvals and commercial execution.

Further Defence Business Development

The Company has continued to evaluate additional international defence opportunities after year-end. Any letter of intent, proposal, tender participation or commercial discussion is inherently subject to due diligence, definitive contracts, regulatory

approvals, end-user requirements and successful execution, and should not be regarded as firm revenue unless and until the relevant conditions are satisfied.

INDUSTRY OVERVIEW

Indian Manufacturing and Precision Engineering

India continues to strengthen its position as a global manufacturing destination, supported by domestic capital expenditure, infrastructure investment, localisation initiatives and supply-chain diversification. The continuing China+1 trend creates opportunities for Indian manufacturers capable of delivering quality, precision, scale and reliable lead times.

Aerospace and Defence

India's aerospace and defence manufacturing ecosystem continues to expand, supported by Make in India, Aatmanirbhar Bharat, localisation of defence procurement and growing participation by private-sector manufacturers. The opportunity is accompanied by high entry barriers, including stringent technical qualification, certification, traceability, regulatory approvals and long customer-development cycles.

- China+1 and diversification of global manufacturing supply chains.
- Localisation of aerospace and defence manufacturing in India.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Company has a Risk Management Framework designed to identify, assess, monitor and mitigate material financial, operational, regulatory, technological and strategic risks. The Board and senior management periodically review major risks affecting the Company's businesses and take appropriate mitigation measures.

As the Group expands into regulated sectors and international markets, the risk-management framework will continue to evolve in line with the increasing scale and complexity of operations.

INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEMS AND THEIR ADEQUACY

The Company maintains internal-control systems commensurate with the size, scale and complexity of its operations. These systems are intended to support appropriate authorisation of transactions, safeguarding of assets, reliability of financial reporting, efficient utilisation of resources and compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

The Internal Audit function is carried out by an independent firm of Chartered Accountants. Internal-audit observations and recommendations are reviewed by Management and the Audit Committee, and corrective measures are implemented where required.

HUMAN RESOURCES

The Company considers its people central to its growth strategy. The transition towards advanced precision, aerospace and defence manufacturing requires specialised talent across production engineering, quality assurance, machining, metallurgy, regulatory compliance, international business development and programme management.

The Group continues to focus on attracting, developing and retaining skilled employees while promoting accountability, technical excellence, continuous learning and a strong safety and quality culture.

The Company's objective is not merely to increase manufacturing volumes, but to progressively move towards higher-value, higher-precision and technologically more sophisticated manufacturing. Subject to successful execution, regulatory compliance, capital discipline and market conditions, Management believes the Group is positioned to enter its next phase as an Indian-headquartered, globally connected precision engineering, aerospace and defence manufacturing enterprise.

Notes to Standalone Financial Statements for the year ended March 31, 2026

1 Company Overview and Significant Accounting Policies

1.1 Company Overview

M/s Sunita Tools Ltd (Formerly known as Sunita Tools Private Limited) Company incorporated on 12th January 1988 , having its registered office at Survey No.66, Plot No.A, Valiv, Sativali Road, Vasai East, Palghar, Vasai East IE, Thane, Vasai, Maharashtra, India, 401208. The nature of the operations and princial activities of the company is manufacturing, machining & grinding of engineering of goods, steel plates & manufacture of mould base & dies sets.

1.2 Basis of preparation and presentation of Financial Statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles ('GAAP') in India under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting. These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (hereinafter together referred to as 'the Act') and Schedule III of the Act.

a) Section 26 of part I of Chapter III of the Act

b) relevant provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements Regulations, 2018, issued by the Securities and Exchange Board of India ('SEBI') as amended in pursuance of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992; and

c) Guidance Note on Reports in Company Prospectuses (Revised 2019) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI")

The financial information have been compiled from:

a) the audited financial statement of the Company as at March 31, 2026 which have been approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on May 15, 2026.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year.

Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. The Company's most significant estimates include those on the useful life of assets, deferred taxes and provision for taxes. Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual results could differ from these estimates. Appropriate changes in estimates are made as management becomes aware of changes in circumstances surrounding the estimates.

1.3 Significant accounting policies

a) Current-non-current classification

Assets

An asset is classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- a. it is expected to be realised in, or is intended for sale or consumption in, the company's normal operating cycle;
- b. it is held primarily for the purposes of being traded;
- c. it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting date; or
- d. it is cash or cash equivalent unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date.

Current assets include the current portion of non-current financial assets. All other assets are classified as non-current.

Liabilities

A liability is classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- a. it is expected to be settled in the company's normal operating cycle;
- b. it is held primarily for the purposes of being traded;
- c. it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting date; or
- d. the company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date.

Current liabilities include the current portion of non-current financial liabilities.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes all incidental costs related to acquisition and installation, other pre-operative costs and interest on borrowed funds, if any, used to finance the acquisitions of fixed assets and is capitalized up to the date the assets are ready for commercial use.

Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful life of the assets using written down value method. The rates of depreciation used are those which have been calculated as per the method specified in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. The new Companies Act prescribes that the asset should be written off over its useful life as estimated by the management and provides the indicative useful lives for the different class of assets. Other assets are depreciated over their balance useful life.

c) Impairment of assets

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units at each balance sheet date are reviewed for impairment if any indication of impairment exists.

If the carrying amount of the assets exceed the estimated recoverable amount, an impairment is recognized for such excess amount. The impairment loss is recognized as an expense in the statement of profit and loss, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case any impairment loss of the revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease to the extent a revaluation reserve is available for that asset.

When there is indication that an impairment loss recognized for an asset (other than a revalued asset) in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss, to the extent the amount was previously charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss. In case of revalued assets such reversal is not recognized.

d) Investments

Investments, which are readily realizable and intended to be held for not more than one year from the date on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long-term investments.

On initial recognition, all investments are measured at cost. The cost comprises purchase price and directly attributable acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties. If an investment is acquired, or partly acquired, by the issue of shares or other securities, the acquisition cost is the fair value of the securities issued. If an investment is acquired in exchange for another asset, the acquisition is determined by reference to the fair value of the asset given up or by reference to the fair value of the investment acquired, whichever is more clearly evident.

Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investments.

On disposal of an investment, the difference between its carrying amount and net disposal proceeds is charged or credited to the statement of profit and loss.

e) Inventories

Inventory consists of Raw material, store and spares and Finished goods is valued at cost. Cost of inventories comprises of all cost of purchases and other costs incurred in bringing the inventory to their present location and condition. Cost is assigned on First-In-First-Out (FIFO) basis. Obsolete, defective and unserviceable stocks are provided for, wherever required.

f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash equivalents represent highly liquid investments with remaining maturities, at the date of purchase/investment, of three months or less. As of the balance sheet date, the Company had no such investment. Cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash in hand and balance in bank accounts.

g) Revenue recognition

Sales revenue is recognized when property in the goods with all risk rewards and effective control of goods usually associated with ownership are transferred to buyer at price. Sales comprise trading sales and are exclusive of excise duty and local taxes and sales return. The various discounts and rate differences on the sales those accepted/rejected are accounted in the year, however if the same is of material amount affecting the current year profit/loss are separately shown under the prior period head of the profit and loss account.

h) Other operational revenue

Other operational revenue represent income earned from the activities incidental to the business and is recognized when the right to receive the income is established as per the terms of the contract.

i) Interest

Interest income is recognized on a time proportion basis by considering the amount outstanding and rate applicable.

j) Employee benefits

Contributions to secure retiral benefits in respect of provident fund, based on applicable rules/status, are charges to revenue.

k)Borrowing cost

As per AS 16, borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets, which are assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use or sale, are added to the cost of those assets, until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use or sale.

l)Income taxes

Tax expense comprises current tax (i.e. amount of tax for the period determined in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961), deferred tax charge or benefit (reflecting the tax effect of timing differences between accounting income and taxable income for the period) and minimum alternate tax.

Current tax

Provision for income tax is recognized based on estimated tax liability computed after adjusting for allowances, disallowances and exemptions in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred tax

The deferred tax charge or benefit and the corresponding deferred tax liabilities and assets are recognized using the tax rates that have been enacted or substantially enacted as at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent there is reasonable certainty that the asset can be realized in future, however, where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward loss under taxation laws, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is a virtual certainty of realization of the assets. Deferred tax assets are reviewed as at each balance sheet date and written down or written up to reflect the amount that is reasonably/virtually certain to be realized.

m) Earnings per share

The Company reports basic earnings per share (EPS) in accordance with Accounting Standard - 20. The basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit/loss attributable to equity shareholders for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. The Company has no potentially dilutive equity shares outstanding during the period.

n) Segment Reporting

The Company operates in a single primary business segment . Hence, there are no reportable segment as per AS 17 Segment Reporting.

o)Provisions and contingent liabilities

The Company recognizes a provision when there is a present obligation arising from a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. Where there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

p) Leases

Operating Lease:

Where the lessor effectively retain substantially all the risks & benefits of ownership of leased item, these are classified as operating lease. Operating lease payments are recognised as expenses in the statement of profits & loss accounts on straight line basis over lease term. Initial cost such as legal cost, brokerage costs, etc are recognised immediately in the statement of profit & loss account.

q) Foreign Currency transaction

Foreign currency transactions are accounted for at the exchange rate prevailing on transaction date. Foreign currency monetary assets & liabilities are translated at year end exchange rate. The exchange differences arising on foreign currency transactions are recognised as income or expense in the period in which they arise.

r) Previous year figures

Previous figures have been regrouped /reclassified whenever necessary.

s) Recent pronouncements

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements for the year ended March 31, 2026

1 Company Overview and Significant Accounting Policies

1.1 Company Overview

M/s Sunita Tools Ltd (Formerly known as Sunita Tools Private Limited) Company incorporated on 12th January 1988 , having its registered office at Survey No.66, Plot No.A, Valiv, Sativali Road, Vasai East, Palghar, Vasai East IE, Thane, Vasai, Maharashtra, India, 401208. The nature of the operations and principal activities of the company is manufacturing, machining & grinding of engineering of goods, steel plates & manufacture of mould base & dies sets.

1.2 Basis of preparation and presentation of Financial Statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles ('GAAP') in India under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting. These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (hereinafter together referred to as 'the Act') and Schedule III of the Act.

- a) Section 26 of part I of Chapter III of the Act
- b) relevant provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements Regulations, 2018, issued by the Securities and Exchange Board of India ('SEBI') as amended in pursuance of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992; and
- c) Guidance Note on Reports in Company Prospectuses (Revised 2019) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI").

The financial information have been compiled from:

- a) the audited financial statement of the Company as at March 31, 2026 which have been approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on May 15, 2026.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year.

Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. The Company's most significant estimates include those on the useful life of assets, deferred taxes and provision for taxes. Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual results could differ from these estimates. Appropriate changes in estimates are made as management becomes aware of changes in circumstances surrounding the estimates.

1.3 Significant accounting policies

a) Current-non-current classification

Assets

An asset is classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- a. it is expected to be realised in, or is intended for sale or consumption in, the company's normal operating cycle;
- b. it is held primarily for the purposes of being traded;
- c. it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting date; or
- d. it is cash or cash equivalent unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date.

Current assets include the current portion of non-current financial assets. All other assets are classified as non-current.

Liabilities

A liability is classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- a. it is expected to be settled in the company's normal operating cycle;
- b. it is held primarily for the purposes of being traded;
- c. it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting date; or
- d. the company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date.

Current liabilities include the current portion of non-current financial liabilities.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes all incidental costs related to acquisition and installation, other pre-operative costs and interest on borrowed funds, if any, used to finance the acquisitions of fixed assets and is capitalized up to the date the assets are ready for commercial use.

Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful life of the assets using written down value method. The rates of depreciation used are those which have been calculated as per the method specified in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. The new Companies Act prescribes that the asset should be written off over its useful life as estimated by the management and provides the indicative useful lives for the different class of assets. Other assets are depreciated over their balance useful life.

c) Impairment of assets

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units at each balance sheet date are reviewed for impairment if any indication of impairment exists.

If the carrying amount of the assets exceed the estimated recoverable amount, an impairment is recognized for such excess amount. The impairment loss is recognized as an expense in the statement of profit and loss, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case any impairment loss of the revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease to the extent a revaluation reserve is available for that asset.

When there is indication that an impairment loss recognized for an asset (other than a revalued asset) in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss, to the extent the amount was previously charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss. In case of revalued assets such reversal is not recognized.

d) Investments

Investments, which are readily realizable and intended to be held for not more than one year from the date on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long-term investments.

On initial recognition, all investments are measured at cost. The cost comprises purchase price and directly attributable acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties. If an investment is acquired, or partly acquired, by the issue of shares or other securities, the acquisition cost is the fair value of the securities issued. If an investment is acquired in exchange for another asset, the acquisition is determined by reference to the fair value of the asset given up or by reference to the fair value of the investment acquired, whichever is more clearly evident.

Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investments.

On disposal of an investment, the difference between its carrying amount and net disposal proceeds is charged or credited to the statement of profit and loss.

e) Inventories

Inventory consists of Raw material, store and spares and Finished goods is valued at cost. Cost of inventories comprises of all cost of purchases and other costs incurred in bringing the inventory to their present location and condition. Cost is assigned on First-In-First-Out (FIFO) basis. Obsolete, defective and unserviceable stocks are provided for, wherever required.

f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash equivalents represent highly liquid investments with remaining maturities, at the date of purchase/investment, of three months or less. As of the balance sheet date, the Company had no such investment. Cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash in hand and balance in bank accounts.

g) Revenue recognition

Sales revenue is recognized when property in the goods with all risk rewards and effective control of goods usually associated with ownership are transferred to buyer at price. Sales comprise trading sales and are exclusive of excise duty and local taxes and sales return. The various discounts and rate differences on the sales those accepted/rejected are accounted in the year, however if the same is of material amount effecting the current year profit/loss are separately shown under the prior period head of the profit and loss account.

h) Other operational revenue

Other operational revenue represent income earned from the activities incidental to the business and is recognized when the right to receive the income is established as per the terms of the contract.

i) Interest

Interest income is recognized on a time proportion basis by considering the amount outstanding and rate applicable.

j) Employee benefits

Contributions to secure retiral benefits in respect of provident fund, based on applicable rules/status, are charges to revenue.

k) Borrowing cost

As per AS 16, borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets, which are assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use or sale, are added to the cost of those assets, until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use or sale.

l) Income taxes

Tax expense comprises current tax (i.e. amount of tax for the period determined in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961), deferred tax charge or benefit (reflecting the tax effect of timing differences between accounting income and taxable income for the period) and minimum alternate tax.

Current tax

Provision for income tax is recognized based on estimated tax liability computed after adjusting for allowances, disallowances and exemptions in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred tax

The deferred tax charge or benefit and the corresponding deferred tax liabilities and assets are recognized using the tax rates that have been enacted or substantially enacted as at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent there is reasonable certainty that the asset can be realized in future, however, where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward loss under taxation laws, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is a virtual certainty of realization of the assets. Deferred tax assets are reviewed as at each balance sheet date and written down or written up to reflect the amount that is reasonably/virtually certain to be realized.

m) Earnings per share

The Company reports basic earnings per share (EPS) in accordance with Accounting Standard - 20. The basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit/loss attributable to equity shareholders for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. The Company has no potentially dilutive equity shares outstanding during the period.

n) Segment Reporting

The Company operates in a single primary business segment . Hence, there are no reportable segment as per AS 17 Segment Reporting.

o)Provisions and contingent liabilities

The Company recognizes a provision when there is a present obligation arising from a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. Where there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

p) Leases

Operating Lease:

Where the lessor effectively retain substantially all the risks & benefits of ownership of leased item , these are classified as operating lease. Operating lease payments are recognised as expenses in the statement of profits & loss accounts on straight line basis over lease term. Initial cost such as legal cost, brokerage costs ,etc are recognised immediately in the statement of profit & loss account.

q) Foreign Currency transaction

Foreign currency transactions are accounted for at the exchange rate prevailing on transaction date. Foreign currency monetary assets & liabilities are translated at year end exchange rate. The exchange differences arising on foreign currency transactions are recognised as income or expense in the period in which they arise.

r)Previous year figures

Previous figures have been regrouped /reclassified whenever necessary .

s)Recent pronouncements

Ministry of Corporate Affairs ("MCA") notifies new standards or amendments to the existing standards under Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules as issued from time to time. For the year ended March 31, 2025, MCA has not notified any new standards or amendments to the existing standards applicable to the Company.
